

Guide to sorted refuse collection

Fines from 167 euros will be imposed on anyone dumping refuse in the street or failing to sort recyclable items.

PAPER, CARDBOARD AND DRINKS CARTONS



Newspapers, text and exercise books, envelopes, wrappers, photocopies, paper sheets, flyers and leaflets; paper bags; cartons (e.g. Tetra Pak) for beverages and food products (juices, milk, wine, purees and legumes); packets, cardboard boxes of all sizes; corrugated cardboard; lightly soiled pizza boxes.

Important: paper heavily soiled with food or other matter must not be mixed with recyclable paper. IT IS FORBIDDEN TO PLACE PAPER AND CARDBOARD IN PLASTIC BAGS.

Plastic coated, chemical and wax paper; paper and cardboard heavily soiled with food and no other substances.

GLASS, PLASTIC, CANS AND METALS



Bottles, jars, trays and containers made of glass, plastic, aluminium and metal; buckets and bowls; empty tubes; cans; cellophane, foil and transparent film; plastic bags of all sizes, including pouches, shoppers and mesh carriers; packs and wrappers used for biscuits, snacks and potato crisps; disposable plastic plates and cups free of residual matter; empty spray cans; lids, wire cages, corks and caps/stoppers.

Important: materials must not contain residues of food or of the packaged product.

Porcelain, ceramic and Pyrex, drinking glasses; crystal; mirrors, panes of glass, light bulbs and neon tubes; disposable plastic cutlery; toys and rubber items.

ORGANIC FRACTION



Kitchen waste, food leftovers, fruit and vegetables, stale bread, eggshells; coffee grounds and tea bags; foods turned stale or past expiry date; cut flowers and house plants; soiled paper napkins; heavily soiled pizza boxes (reduced to small pieces); small pet litter.

Important: seal bags securely to prevent unpleasant smells.

Nappies and sanitary towels; rags; wrappers and packaging.

DRY REFUSE



Soiled rags, rubber; plastic coated, chemical and wax paper; drinking glasses, crystal beakers; nappies and sanitary towels; syringes and needles with cap; vacuum cleaner bags; small wooden objects; broken toys containing no electrical or electronic components; ceramic, porcelain and terracotta; felt tip markers, scissors, pens and pencils; audio and video cassettes, floppy disks, compact disks.

Bulky and inert items; paper, cardboard and drinks cartons (e.g. Tetra Pak); glass, plastic and cans; no organic fraction.
